LOS ANGELES: A 5.7 magnitude earthquake struck near southern California's border with Mex-ico on Monday, rattling buildings across a wide area, the US geological survey said.

The quake hit 8km southeast of Ocotillo, a desert town some 320km southeast of Los Angeles, and was followed by a cluster of more than 10 aftershocks.

There were no immediate reports of injuries or e but the tembior was felt throughout the region, rattling buildings in Los Angeles and even shaking a stadium hosting a major league baseball game in San Diego, reports said.

Aseismologist from the California institute of technology said the quake was an aftershock of the 7.2 magnitude temblor which rattled northwest-ern Mexico in April, leav-

ing two people dead. Geologists say an earthquake capable of causing widespread destruction is 99% certain to hit Califor-nia within the next 30

years.
Studies have said that a 7.8 magnitude quake in the densely-populated region could kill 1,800 people, injure 50,000 more and damage 300,000 buildings. – AFP

NASA to predict tsunami size

LOS ANGELES: NASA says a research team has nstrated a prototype for an improved tsunami prediction system. The agency said on Monday that the team, led by a researcher at NASA's jet propulsion laboratory, successfully predicted the size of the tsuna mi triggered by the Feb 27 magnitude 8.8 Chilean earthquake. The system, using NASA's global differential GPS network, predicted a moderate tsunami unlikely to cause significant destruction in the Pacific. Team leader Y. Tony Song says the system could allow emergency agencies to issue better warnings and reduce false alarms. The GPS network used in the system combines global and regional real time data from hundreds of GPS sites to estimate their positions every second, detecting ground motions as small as a few centimetres.

Two caught at army base

TALLAHASSEE: The US military says two heavily armed people are in custody after trying to enter MacDill Air Force Base outside of Tampa. The ba home to US Central Command, which runs the US wars in Afghanistan and Iraq. Base public affairs officer Senior Airman Katherine Holt said a man and woman were unable to show proper identification on Monday evening, and their vehicle was searched. Security found military-style gear and weapons in the sport utility vehicle but no explosives. Holt said she did not know how many weapons were removed but they were rifle-type. The suspects' names were not released. The military is investigating and says the base is operating normally.

Elton John hater goes free

ATLANTA: Charges against a Georgia man charged with threatening singer Elton John were dismissed on the day a trial was scheduled to begin. Fulton county superior court judge Kimberly Esmond Adams dismissed the charges against Neal Horsley on Monday. The 65-year-old Horsley was charged with making terrorist threats, criminal defamation and using the internet to disseminate threats. Prosecutors said Horsley posted threats against John online and that he picketed outside John's Atlanta condominium with a sign that said "Why Elton John must die". John apparently raised Horsley's ire when he told an interviewer that he believed Jesus was gay. The judge said Horsley's actions did not warrant criminal

No reality show for teen sailor

LOS ANGELES: A spokesman for the family of the California girl who was rescued from the Indian Ocea while trying to sail around the world says the family has no current plans for a reality TV show. Jeff Casher says he spoke with Abby Sunderland's father on Monday and Laurence Sunderland says such a show was discussed last year when her brother Zac sailed around the world, but it never came about. Magnetic Entertainment lists plans for the show on its website. Officials from the company did not return calls on Monday. The New York Post reported on Monday that Laurence Sunderland signed a contract for a sho weeks after his daughter set sail. —AP.
